GENESIS 12:1-3

- » **1** † ¶ Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee:
- » **2** † And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing:
- » **3** † And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.

ROMANS 4:3-8

- » **3** † For what saith the scripture? Abraham believed God, and it was counted unto him for righteousness.
- » **4** † Now to him that worketh is the reward not reckoned of grace, but of debt.
- » **5** † But to him that worketh not, but believeth on him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness.
- » **6** † Even as David also describeth the blessedness of the man, unto whom God imputeth righteousness without works,
- » **7** † Saying, Blessed are they whose iniquities are forgiven, and whose sins are covered.

« **62** † Notice, we want to go back and think. Paul here is referring back to an Old Testament character. In the Book of Genesis we take up the life of Abraham from the 12th chapter of Genesis: God giving Abraham the promise, and through Abraham would come the righteous Seed. **And Abraham, as believed by many to be a Jew, he was not. Abraham was a Gentile, a Chaldean from the city of Ur. And he became God's servant, not because he was different from anyone else, but because of the election of God.**

« **E-34** † The Bible said in Hebrews 4, that, "Abraham staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strong giving praise to God." And we are suppose to be Abraham's seed. "For we who are dead in Christ are Abraham's seed." Is that right? The Holy Spirit makes us Abraham's seed.

Abraham was not a Jew. Abraham was a Gentile. But it wasn't Jew nor Gentile; it was his faith in God's Word was what made him--him to be--to be an heir of the promise. And we being dead in Christ are Abraham's seed and are heirs with Him, according to the promise. I tell you; that's true; we are, but sometimes we don't act like it.

Sometimes we go and say, "Well, I'll go and be prayed for. I'll see what happens. Well, I don't feel a bit different." Abraham's seed? Oh, my. That's a poor excuse for a... even for a church member, let alone being Abraham's seed. Abraham's seed don't look at no circumstances; it looks at the Word of God. That's all.

« **E-15** † That's the way it is today. That's the way it was forty years ago with our fathers, our Pentecostal fathers. Grace had given them a revival, and had brought them out of the world, and out of the chaos that they were in, in their formal denominations and organizations, and so forth, and had brought them to a greatest revival that they'd ever had, poured out the Holy Ghost upon them, filled them with the Spirit. They were singing, dancing in the Spirit, having a wonderful time. And little did they know that they were all these years away from the full promise.

But as it was with Israel natural, so is it with Israel spiritual. We are Israelites because we are the seed of Abraham. « **E-40** † Let's just speak of a few characters that met God. **Let's think of Abraham. He was just an ordinary man. He was not any special person. You don't have to be a special person to meet God. You just have to be who you are, and then meet God.**

Now, Abraham was not a Jew. Abraham was a Gentile from the land of Chaldea and the city of Ur. And he was just an ordinary man, walking out into the--the fields. And perhaps he come down from--from the tower of Babel with his father.
