LUKE 1:11-47

Now, I want you to watch the difference. There was a old preacher, had plenty of examples, Sarah received a child when she was older than what his wife was. Hannah, at the temple, praying in such a way, till the priest thought she was drunk... Many of God's people are misunderstood. They're not crazy. They're just misunderstood.
