**LEVITICUS 23: 1-14**

» 1 <sup>+</sup> ¶ And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

» 2 † Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, Concerning the feasts of the LORD, which ye shall proclaim to be holy convocations, even these are my feasts.

# PASSOVER

**EXODUS 12:1** 

> 1 + ¶ And the LORD spake unto Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying,
> 2 + This month shall be unto you the beginning of months: it shall be the first month of the year to you.

» 3 <sup>+</sup> Speak ye unto all the congregation of Israel, saying, In the tenth day of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb, according to the house of their fathers, a lamb for an house:

» 4 <sup>†</sup> And if the household be too little for the lamb, let him and his neighbour next unto his house take it according to the number of the souls; every man according to his eating shall make your count for the lamb.

 $\sim$  5 <sup>+</sup> Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year: ye shall take it out from the sheep, or from the goats:

» 6 <sup>†</sup> And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it in the evening.

» 7 <sup>+</sup> And they shall take of the blood, and strike it on the two side posts and on the upper door post of the houses, wherein they shall eat it.

8 † And they shall eat the flesh in that night, roast with fire, and unleavened bread; and with bitter herbs they shall eat it.

#### **UNLEAVENED BREAD**

#### EXODUS 12:15

» 15 <sup>+</sup> Seven days shall ye eat unleavened bread; even the first day ye shall put away leaven out of your houses: for whosoever eateth leavened bread from the first day until the seventh day, that soul shall be cut off from Israel.

» 16 <sup>+</sup> And in the first day there shall be an holy convocation, and in the seventh day there shall be an holy convocation to you; no manner of work shall be done in them, save that which every man must eat, that only may be done of you.

» 17 <sup>+</sup> And ye shall observe the feast of unleavened bread; for in this selfsame day have I brought your armies out of the land of Egypt: therefore shall ye observe this day in your generations by an ordinance for ever.

» 18 <sup>+</sup> In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at even, ye shall eat unleavened bread, until the one and twentieth day of the month at even.

» 19 <sup>+</sup> Seven days shall there be no leaven found in your houses: for whosoever eateth that which is leavened, even that soul shall be cut off from the congregation of Israel, whether he be a stranger, or born in the land.

## FIRST FRUITS

**LEVITICUS 23: 9-14** 

9 † And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

» 10 <sup>+</sup> Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, When ye be come into the land which I give unto you, and shall reap the harvest thereof, then ye shall bring a sheaf of the firstfruits of your harvest unto the priest:

>> 11 + And he shall wave the sheaf before the LORD, to be accepted for you: on the morrow after the sabbath the priest shall wave it.

## **NEHEMIAH 10:34-37**

34 <sup>+</sup> And we cast the lots among the priests, the Levites, and the people, for the wood offering, to bring it into the house of our God, after the houses of our fathers, at times appointed year by year, to burn upon the altar of the LORD our God, as it is written in the law:
35 <sup>+</sup> And to bring the firstfruits of our ground, and the firstfruits of all fruit of all trees, year by year, unto the house of the LORD:

# **GREEK LEXICON -- STRONG'S NUMBER 1181**

1) a tenth part of anything, a tithe. In the Old Testament there were three tithes. One was used to support the Levites (Nu. 18:21-28). This freed the Levites to provide civil and religious leadership. Essentially this tithe supported the government of ancient Israel. A tithe of this tithe went to support the high priest. The next tithe was a tithe of the produce of the land and the first fruits. (Dt. 12:5-18) This tithe was the worship offering the Israelites gave to God and was used to support the religious festivals of the day. Lastly, every third year an additional tithe was gathered to support the state welfare system. (Dt. 14:22-27) This went to the fatherless, the widows, and the strangers in the land. Tithing in the Old Testament represented about 23 1/3 percent of the average annual income, and corresponds to our modern tax system. Both are used to support the government for the good of the people.
