- **They didn't believe It.** Oh, they liked to see the miracles. They liked to hear the prophet.
- But as far as believing It, they didn't. Their lives proves they didn't.
- "Now," He said, "don't you fall after that same example of unbelief." For in this last days, to the Gentile church, God has appeared again; same sign, same wonder, same Pillar of Fire, vindicated, proven.





» 2 † And there was no water for the congregation: and they gathered themselves together against Moses and against Aaron.

» 3 † And the people chode with Moses, and spake, saying, Would God that we had died when our brethren died before the LORD!

» 4 † And why have ye brought up the congregation of the LORD into this wilderness, that we and our cattle should die there?



14/14 Provocations – Loathing the Light Bread


