
Say it out loud. Say it over and over; just keep saying, "I'm healed. I'm healed." Say it until actually you believe it. And when you believe it, then it's going to take place.

Listen close. You'll never live above your confession.







## The High Priest

- In the Old Testament, the primary purpose of the high priest was to serve as a representative and mediator between the people and Yahweh.
- It was the high priest's responsibility to see that the covenant was enforced, and to direct people to complete the duties of the temple and the law of Moses.
- As the representative for the nation of Israel, the high priest had a tremendous responsibility to direct the hearts of the people toward God and the fulfillment of the covenant.
- Throughout the Old Testament, there is a foreshadowing and forward-reaching hope of a more perfect high priesthood that can represent Yahweh effectively and be a sufficient mediator for the people of Israel. The cyclical pattern of the lives of good and poor high priests makes it clear that no human being can fully perform this responsibility.


