



Selfishness

1.Adam and Eve (Genesis 3:1-19): Adam and Eve's selfish decision to eat what was forbidden led to sin entering the world and the fall of humanity.

2.Cain (Genesis 4:1-16): **Cain's jealousy and selfishness** led him to murder his brother Abel when God accepted Abel's offering but rejected Cain's.

3.Lot (Genesis 13:5-13): When given a choice, **Lot selfishly chose the best land for himself**, even though it meant living near the wicked cities of Sodom and Gomorrah. His selfish decision eventually led to trouble for him and his family.

4. The Rich Young Ruler (Matthew 19:16-22): The rich young ruler's **selfish attachment** to his possessions kept him from following Jesus.

5.Judas Iscariot (Matthew 26:14-16): **Judas' selfish greed** led him to betray Jesus for thirty pieces of silver.

6.Ananias and Sapphira (Acts 5:1-11): This couple **selfishly kept back** a portion of the proceeds from the sale of their land while claiming to have given everything to the church.

Your Selfishness vs God's Will

- I will ascend into heaven (Isaiah 14:13a)
 Satan's desire to elevate himself above God and to be worshipped as God.
- I will exalt my throne above the stars of God (Isaiah 14:13b)
 Satan's ambition to have authority and dominion over the angels and the entire celestial realm.
- I will sit also upon the mount of the congregation, in the sides of the north (Isaiah 14:13c) Satan's desire to establish his own kingdom and to be the ruler of the world.
- I will ascend above the heights of the clouds (Isaiah 14:14a) Satan's aspiration to be above all creation and to have power over the heavens.
- I will be like the most High (Isaiah 14:14b)
 The ultimate expression of Satan's pride and his desire to be equal with God.

The human pursuit of power, dominance, and **control over others and our circumstances**.

We should **submit to God and trust** in His sovereignty.

"I will be like the most High"

The human temptation **to act as our own gods**, determining what is right and wrong for ourselves and others.

God alone is the source of truth and we should submit to His will.

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts. Isaiah 55:8-9

Sacrifice Your: Sinful behaviors and attitudes

 Mortify therefore your members which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection, evil concupiscence, and covetousness, which is idolatry (Colossians 3:5).

Mortification of Our Deeds

Sacrifice Your **Possessions**

But this I say, He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully. Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver. (2 Corinthians 9:6-7).

And he looked up, and saw the rich men casting their gifts into the treasury. And he saw also a certain poor widow casting in thither two mites. And he said, Of a truth I say unto you, that this poor widow hath cast in more than they all. (Luke 21:1-3)

Transparency

Being open and accountable, not hiding or concealing wrongdoing.

But have renounced the hidden things of dishonesty, not walking in craftiness, nor handling the word of God deceitfully; but by manifestation of the truth commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God. (2 Corinthians 4:2).

Reliability

Being dependable and trustworthy, following through on commitments and promises (Matthew 5:37).
