

Conscience is a person's **sense of right and wrong**, acting as a guide to one's behavior.

It's an inner feeling or voice that provides direction, and makes one feel guilty when one does something wrong.

What are some signs of A Good Conscience?

You strive to do the right thing

You consistently make an effort to do what you believe is right, even when it's difficult or unpopular.

You feel at peace with your decisions

When you make choices that align with your conscience, you experience a sense of inner peace and contentment.

You're honest and truthful

You value honesty and strive to be truthful in your interactions with others, even when it might be easier to lie or withhold information.

HEBREWS 13:18

What is **Honesty?**

- •Truthfulness: Conveying information that is factual, accurate, and free from lies or misrepresentation.
- •Sincerity: Expressing your authentic thoughts, feelings, and intentions, without pretense or ulterior motives.
- •Straightforwardness: **Communicating clearly and directly**, avoiding evasiveness or misleading statements.

What is **Honesty?**

PROVERBS 12:22

» 22 † Lying lips are abomination to the LORD: but they that deal truly are his delight.

COLOSSIANS 3:9-10

- » 9 † Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds;
- » 10 † And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him:

What is **Honesty?**

Honesty is essential for building trust and maintaining integrity.

- 1. When you are consistently truthful, others learn that they can rely on you and your word.
- 2. Being honest demonstrates integrity, which is the quality of being principled, morally upright, and consistently adhering to standards.
- 3. Consistently being honest builds credibility and a positive reputation. People are more likely to trust and rely on individuals known for their honesty, both personally and professionally.
- 4. Honesty promotes transparency. And when people are transparent, it reduces misunderstandings, facilitates problem-solving, and creates an environment of collaboration and shared understanding.

What about Equivocation?

To **equivocate** is to say something in a way that can be understood multiple ways, especially so that people will think you mean one thing when you really mean another. It's choosing and arranging your words carefully so that you're not quite lying but so that your listener winds up *deceived or misled*.

- **1.Vagueness**: Making statements that are unclear, indefinite, or open to various interpretations to avoid providing a straightforward answer.
- **2.Evasion**: Dodging direct questions or avoiding specific commitments.
- **3.Mental reservation**: Withholding crucial information or mentally adding qualifiers to a statement that are not explicitly communicated to the listener.

Examples:

- •When asked if you finished a project, replying "I worked on it" without mentioning that you didn't complete it.
- •Saying "I didn't see them today" to imply you haven't seen the person at all, when in fact you saw them yesterday.
- •Responding to a question with another question or an unrelated statement to avoid giving a direct answer.

Summary of the Book of Hebrews

The Deity of Jesus:
